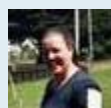

The Story of the Samoyed from the Pound

I decided to write this, for people to learn that letting a dog 'Do what it likes', can cause Bad Temperament. I have called him "SAM", short for all the Samoyeds out there that don't have a home.

This story is sad and if you don't want to be upset, you may wish not to read anymore.

On Thursday, I got a phone call from the Wellington Pound. They had a 5 year old de-sexed male Samoyed up for adoption. They felt he needed a home with someone that knew Samoyeds. We talked for a while about the past owner who tied him up and said that SAM 'Had no problems'.

The Pound had a family in Otaki that wanted SAM. I said that would be good, I can see them daily to help with any problems.

I telephone on Friday, but the home in Otaki was now

getting a German Shepherd. I explained that I was away and couldn't do anything until Wednesday. The Pound said it wasn't a problem, as they would keep him a week.

In the meantime, the committee was looking for a home for him. On Tuesday, Lynne Barr telephoned the Pound to see if he was still there, only to be told that the Vet was coming tomorrow morning to put SAM and several other dogs to sleep!

After many phone calls by Lynne, the Pound agreed to keep him till we picked him up on Wednesday.

As Lynne and I travelled to the Pound, we discussed the different things we had heard about SAM; we would need to assess him and whether he should be re-housed.

We spotted SAM straightaway, sitting there watching us walk towards him. Lovely big broad skull, good bone, good white outer coat. Lynne and I knew he had good breeding behind him.

I felt he was at least 8 years old (very hard to tell) but he had a very mature look in his face and eyes (which were large & round).

I looked for sores or pain that might cause him to turn nasty, gave his fur the odd tug, watched him move. He seemed a normal Samoyed with no problems except the eyes looked a bit sore. The outer coat looked nice, but the inner coat was solid and needed a big groom out.

He travelled well in the

plastic crate, walked and toileted him, removed the rear-end coat, everything was fine.

We needed to remove some of the old coat, big solid matt's behind his ears and underneath him, so with a bit of firmness, we had him lying on his side. Luckily I was working on the matts round his neck, when I felt him 'Have-a-go at us', I grabbed a handful of coat on his neck, so that he couldn't bite and pulled him against me, talked to him until he relaxed.

Lynne and I took it fairly easy on the grooming, cutting out matts and not been rough, but he had 'another-go', more serious. When he had the 3rd 'go-at-us', he would have drawn blood if I hadn't stopped him. He took 5 minutes to calm down before I could let go of him.

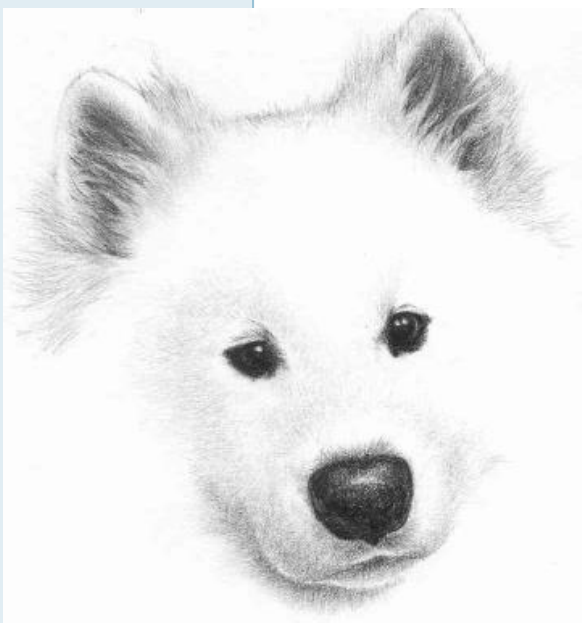
We had a cuppa and talked about what to do. SAM wandered around, came to us for pats. When I picked up his lead, he wanted it on.

We were now starting to understand why we got conflicting information about SAM from the Pound.

Over the next 2 days, I watched and assessed him with an Obedience lady that has done a lot of Rescue work.

SAM was easy-going but had got used to having his own way. If you tried to

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get a toy off him or put him in a cage, he would growl; if pushed, he would have bitten.

After talking to different people, we made the decision that even if we had the money, time and place to house and re-train him 'Not-to-bite', the chance of him getting his own way living with a family was high. It would then only be a matter of time that he would bite if pushed. SAM could not be re-housed.

If I had any doubt whether I was doing the right thing, it was gone watching him at the vets. The vet and I had been feeding him Smacko, put muzzle on him, still feeding him, everything was nice and calm. The vet picked up his leg and started to scissor the coat and he turned into the nastiest dog I had ever seen. Even the Vet was taken aback.

It is a bit hard to know 'why SAM turned into a biter'.

We know that he has had at least 2 owners (but I think he has had several) I think his coat was left until knotty before being groomed, it hurt so he growled or mouthed and the person stopped grooming. I wondered if he had been to a grooming parlour? I have heard that some places muzzle the dog so that it is faster to pull out the knots.

There are a few things that should be done with all dogs when a pup. You teach the dog at an early age that you decide what the dog is allowed to eat or do.

Give a pup food or a toy and then take it away again. Wait until it stands and sits quietly and then give it back.

Spend 5 minutes per day grooming. This should be a positive time. Most people use a brush but I often use a comb so I can go through the coat and gentle tease out any knots.

You could give a biscuit or treat after the groom.

The grooming could be done with an older dog that doesn't like grooming. Each day groom a different leg, groom the head another day, the rear one day, and then the body.

If you are having trouble with your Samoyed or concerned about something, Please ask This is what your Club is for.

On a positive note, the other Samoyeds that we have re-housed, have all settled well into there new homes. My aim is to sort out problems or help with re-housing before the dog ends up at the pound

ness and presentation of our dogs.

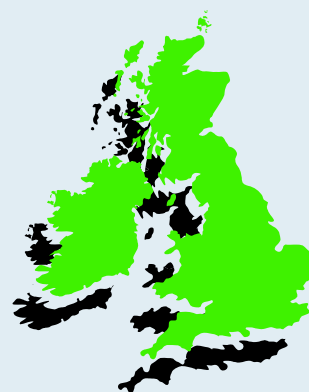

Xylitol – SUGAR FREE GUM

This is not something that I have heard of previously. I've confirmed the information via the American Veterinary Medical Association.

Xylitol warning: Sugar free gum, candy, etc.

This is a danger I was unaware of until Friday. Xylitol is a sugar substitute that is being used now in some sugarless gums and candies as well as other products. I found a reference to a toothpaste with xylitol, for example. Xylitol is very toxic to dogs. If I'd known this, I never would have been casual about leaving a pack of gum lying around the house, any more than I would be casual leaving a bottle of poison within their reach.

Please help spread the knowledge of this danger so no dogs have to go through what mine are

even as I type this.

My Keeshonden have been in the emergency vet hospital since Friday evening after getting into a nearly full pack of Trident sugarless gum.

Worrying about whether that much gum would cause an intestinal obstruction, I got on-line to check. To my surprise and horror, I found several articles about Xylitol poisoning in dogs. This substance is not digested by humans but is by dogs. It causes insulin production and a resulting drop in the dog's blood sugar. Hypoglycemia is the result, with possible seizures, coma and permanent liver damage.

Deaths have been reported as well.

A quick check showed Xylitol was in the gum my fur boys ate. Off we went to the emergency vets. Animal poison control was called and their protocols are being followed to try and prevent liver damage in my dogs. In less than an hour, my boys' blood sugars were already dropping. Nor-

mal is in the 80 range. My boys were down to 71 and 59 already.

Because I happened to do this check on the gum, having no idea the gum itself was toxic, it looks like I did get my dogs to the vet in time.

They have been on a dextrose drip since animal poison control was consulted.

The dextrose has done its job, and my dogs have had none of the complications that go with Xylitol poisoning. We won't be out of the woods, however, until the drip is removed some time later today (Sunday). When this happens, we will see how their bodies respond. Hopefully their blood sugar levels will stabilize and we can put this nightmare behind us.

Please cross post to your dog lists and forums. Inform your friends, neighbors, dog training groups, etc. We need to spread the word about this danger so that as many dog owners as possible become aware of the presence of Xylitol in the items we bring into our homes, and the danger it poses to our dogs.

Blood in vomit

It is not their most pleasant characteristic, but dogs and cats vomit much more often than people do. It is nature's way of coping with their free-wheeling appetites. They often eat things that don't agree with them, and as soon as they empty their stomachs, they feel better.

But when blood is coming up along with the vomit, you need to call your vet. Bloody vomit doesn't always indicate a serious problem, but sometimes it does -- and moving quickly can make all the difference, says A. David Scheele, D.V.M., a veterinarian in private practice in Midland, Texas.

Stomach ulcers are often to blame, says Dan M. Jordan, D.V.M., a veterinarian in private practice in Houston. Pets with ulcers are typically being treated for arthritis or other long-term problems, and the medications they are taking, such as aspirin, are irritating their stomachs and causing bleeding. "We see more ulcers in older pets because they are the ones most likely to be taking the medications," he says. Blood that is vomited from the stomach usually resembles used coffee grounds, although in some cases it will be bright red, he adds.

Bleeding can also be caused by eating the wrong

foods. Pets that raid the trash or root around in the compost pile may suffer from food poisoning and get miserably nauseated. Their retching can break blood vessels in the esophagus, the tube that carries food from the mouth to the stomach. This isn't a serious problem, but it will cause the vomit to look a little bloody.

One of the most serious -- and all-too-common -- causes of bloody vomit is getting into rodent poison. "These poisons can interfere with the blood-clotting process, which can cause bleeding," says Dr. Jordan. Pets that have eaten poison will often bleed from the mouth, nose, or anus as well.

Sometimes what appears to be bloody vomit is really bloody saliva caused by periodontal disease, for example, or a cut from a sharp bone or stick. "Pets are incredibly stoic and will often continue to eat with very sore teeth and gums," says Dr. Scheele. "You may not realize they have trouble until you see blood."

See Your Vet If...

- Bloody vomit is accompanied by bleeding from her mouth, nose, or anus
- Your pet is being treated for arthritis
- The vomit resembles used coffee grounds

- Pushing on your pet's belly causes her pain
- Your dog or cat hasn't eaten for 24 hours or more
- Her abdomen appears bloated
- She has eaten rodent poison, antifreeze, houseplants, or other harmful substances
- Your pet has been vomiting for more than a day or is vomiting blood
- There are worms or other parasites in the stool
- She has had diarrhea for 24 hours or more
- There is blood in the stool or it looks dark and tarry
- She is scooting across the floor, or the anal area looks swollen
- Your pet has gained or lost substantial amounts of weight
- She is having side effects from medication, like appetite loss or vomiting
- There are growths in the anal area
- There is a bulge in her throat
- She is drooling much more than usual
- Your pet vomits shortly after eating

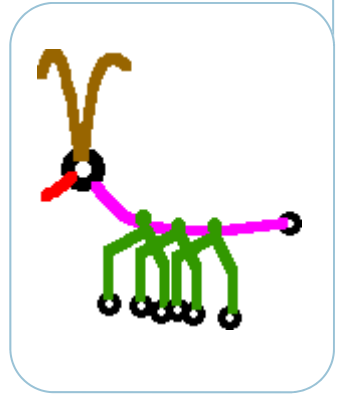
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
Bendable Dog and Person







These bendable, fuzzy magnetic dog and people are simple to make and great to play with later. They make wonderful refrigerator magnets that you can pose in incredible ways.

Supplies needed:

- Colored pipe cleaners (the thick, fuzzy ones and the metallic ones are great for this project)
- Small doughnut-shaped magnets, some tiny, some larger (available at hardware stores)
 - An old scissors or a wire cutter to cut the pipe cleaners



 <p>Twist two long pipe cleaners together to make a sturdy double pipe cleaner.</p>	 <p>Attach the end of the double pipe cleaner to a large, doughnut-shaped magnet. Wrap the pipe cleaner around the magnet a few times to secure it.</p>	 <p>Twist a second short pipe cleaner tightly around the other pipe cleaner. 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 <p>Fold a long pipe cleaner in half (make a V-shape) and thread it through a large doughnut-shaped magnet.</p>	 <p>Starting at the bottom of the V, twist the ends together to form a short, sturdy double pipe cleaner.</p>	 <p>Twist a short pipe cleaner tightly around the other pipe cleaner near the large magnet (this will form the person's arms).</p> <p>Attach a small, doughnut-shaped magnet to the end of each arm (these will be the person's hands).</p>	 <p>Attach a large, doughnut-shaped magnet to the end of the body (this is the person's hips).</p>	 <p>Twist two long pipe cleaners together to make a sturdy double pipe cleaner. Fold it in half and thread it through the hip magnet and wrap it around again to secure it (this V will form the person's long legs).</p> <p>Attach a small, doughnut-shaped magnet to the end of each leg (these will be the person's feet).</p>	 <p>You now have a possible, magnetic person; you can make a whole family and pose them together.</p>
